Twenty Years of Country Dancing

This month marks the 20th anniversary of the North Alabama Country Dance Society. [Wild cheering & applause!] I don't know the actual date of the very first dance, but I am assured that it was in April of 1982. I gather that much of the impetus to hold an old-time country dance was due to Pat and Bill McClain. She could call dances, and he knew a few musicians who could play together, and somebody hired the old church building up on Monte Sano at the Burritt Museum, and someone got a notice printed. People came, they enjoyed themselves. They told their friends, and came back the next month.

Some of the musicians we enjoy to this day were playing for dances in various permutations back in the early years, and the band names were great too: "Sofa Cats" "Lykitor Knot" "Space City String Band".

Here's an item from the April 1992 issue (penned by Bryan Walls for his 2nd newsletter):

"For ten years we have been dancing at the wonderful little church at the Burritt Museum As the dance has grown, the time has come to find a roomier venue."

He goes on to describe the ideal dance hall:

"a wooden floor, great acoustics, lots of parking, inexpensive rental, handy to get to, a beautiful view, friendly landlords, and good temperature control."

A few dances that year were held at the Berachah Gym on Sparkman Drive, but most were still held at the Burritt. By late 1994 about half the dances were held at the Eastside Community Center on Dallas just south of Pratt Ave. Dances continued at the Burritt until the rent got too high. In early 1997 almost all the dances were being held at Faith Presbyterian where they continue to this day.

Local Band Opens for Grammy Winner

Bob & Cathy White and Curt Lewis, who play for us frequently - check this month's schedule - performed on Saturday March 30th as the opening act for Norman Blake. The concert was presented by the Huntsville Traditional Music Association at the Chan auditorium of UAH. Bob, Cathy and Curt lead us on a short tour of southern & Appalachian mountain music, playing tunes they learned from (or by) fiddlers in Georgia, the Carolinas, West Virginia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Tennessee & Alabama. HTMA President Jerry LeCroy mentioned that they played for NACDS and suggested that people come to our dances to hear more of their music.

After their set was over, Norman Blake took the stage and played a few pieces on guitar, including "Big Rock Candy Mountain"; a song he performed on the Grammy winning soundtrack album from the movie, "O Brother Where Art Thou?" He was then joined by his wife Nancy for the rest of the set.

They did a number of songs where they both played guitar, but Nancy really shined when she played mandolin on some of Norman's compositions, such as the "Chattanooga Rag" or the traditional "Jimmie in the Swamp". Ed Baggott said that she is one of the better mandolin players he knows and wishes there were more opportunities to hear her play.
