DANCE IN CHATTANOOGA

I'm two days late getting this newsletter ready for the printer, I have a page to fill, and I don't have any pictures from recent dances. So I thought I'd tell you about a recent visit to Chattanooga.

Kathy and I danced in Chattanooga February 9 and had a great time! It was a full day of dancing that started with an English country dance workshop. The workshop was led by Kendal Brodie with music by Calliope. This was the first time we had tried English country dancing, and we really didn't know what to expect. I had heard something about giving weight differently (giving less weight, to be precise), but it wasn't much to go on.

What we learned is that English country dancing is quite varied, has similar steps to contra dancing (though with different names), and is a lot of fun!

We danced a circle dance that met my vague expectations --

the steps were a little slower, and partners didn't touch beyond allemandes. But the dance was elegant, and we learned new steps -- "set", "back to back", "grand chain", among others.

Later, Kendall called a dance in waltz time that moved through familiar sets of two couples, like contra dancing, but that we stepped through in the left-right-left, right-left-right waltz time. This also had some familiar steps and some new steps. While a little more formal than we generally do in contra dancing, the dance created fun new shapes and was really just a slightly different approach to the familiar fun: smiles, eye contact, gentle pushing and pulling, and swings.

By far, my favorite dance of the afternoon was a 5-couple reel that featured a wild ladies chain, butterfly whirls, and got out of hand in a hurry if you didn't give the situation your full attention!

English country dancing was a blast, Kendall's calling was spot-on, and Calliope was hot!

But the evening was just getting started. The Contranooga group of dancers set out a terrific pot-luck dinner following the workshop that really hit the spot. And as we cleaned up, the crowds began pouring into the hall for the regular contra dance.

We've danced in Chattanooga several times before, and each time I'm amazed again at the number of young newcomers they have and the amount of energy and buoyant emotions they bring with them! Kendall had his hands full getting each new dance started, but once things were underway, we were carried along by the music, calling, and exuberant dancing.

If you like your contras with a healthy dose of youthful vigor and warm hospitality, you could do a lot worse than making the short trek to Chattanooga. And there's a final bonus: you get an hour back on the drive home.
