For the contra dances Friday evening, Saturday morning and evening, and Sunday afternoon, music will be provided by The Sevens, and the caller will be Seth Tepfer. Saturday afternoon you can dance to Intriguing Contras with Jim & Inge Woods and Friends, with calling by our own Gary Nelson and Erin Maguire. Music for Sunday morning's waltzes will be provided again by The Sevens.

The Sevens are a high-energy Celtic ensemble that unites traditional Irish tunes with world rhythms and American songs in a highly original and exciting mix. Whether squares, contras, or other folk dances, you can be certain that all involved - novices and experienced dancers alike - will amble away happy and eager to dance more!

Jim & Inge Wood & Friends share their musical talents by teaching, coordinating and playing music for the contra dance group in Flat Creek, TN, not far from Nashville.

Jim Wood (fiddle), a Nashville native, began playing fiddle at age 10, surrounded by many professional musicians. A formal jazz music college education gives even further dimension to his music. His wife, Inge Wood of Costa Rica (guitar), Hillary Bevels (fiddle), and Nate Strasser (keyboard) are some of the talented musicians that make up the young and energetic Flat Creek contra community.

Erin Maguire, calling since the age of 16, is known for calling dances that flow with energy. She learned to call as a Mother's Day present to her (caller) mother to give her a chance to dance.

Gary Nelson, started calling in Huntsville in 1986, and then moved to Asheville, NC and continued calling throughout the southeast. Known for his clear directions and interesting dance selections, we're glad to have Gary now living back in Huntsville.
